The goal of the **free** training is to provide parents with advocacy and programmatic information that leads to the **prevention** of restraint and seclusion and or the removal of a student with challenging behavior from the education environment. The training is divided into two sessions. The morning session will be presented by Renaldo Fowler, Senior Staff Advocate and JoAnn Sheperd, Staff Attorney from the Arizona Center for Disability Law. The afternoon session will be conducted by Daniel Davidson, Ph.D. Arizona Positive Behavior Support, Institute for Human Development, Northern Arizona University.

The morning session will provide parents with an overview of their rights under the Special Education Law, (IDEA) Individuals with Disabilities Education, and their Civil Rights under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. This session will focus on the Evaluation and (IEP) Individual Education Program development, implementation and compliance.

The afternoon session will offer in-depth programmatic information on the use of positive supports to prevent restraint and seclusion and will address challenging behavior in the educational environment. The session will provide information on: What is Positive Behavior Support? Why Do We Need Positive Behavior Support? and What's Included in Positive Behavior Support?

FROM PHOENIX through PAYSON (191 miles):

Mogollon Route - Take State Hwy 87 north (Beeline Hwy) to Payson, from Payson take State Hwy 260 east following the Mogollon Rim to Show Low. In Show Low, continue on Hwy 260 through Pinetop/Lakeside. Hon-Dah is 3 miles outside of Pinetop at the Junction of Hwy 260 and 73.

FROM PHOENIX through GLOBE (189 miles):

Canyon Route - Take State US Hwy 60 through Globe. From Globe, take Hwy 77 and US Hwy 60 through the Salt River Canyon to Show Low. From Show Low, take State Hwy 260 east through Pinetop/Lakeside. Hon-Dah is 3 miles outside of Pinetop at the Junction of Hwy 260 and Hwy 73.

FROM TUCSON (208 miles):

Take S/R 77 (Oracle Road), north to Oracle Junction and continue on Hwy 77 north to Globe. From Globe, take Hwy 77 and US Hwy 60 through the Salt River Canyon to Show Low. From Show Low, take State Hwy 260 east through Pinetop/Lakeside. Hon-Dah is 3 miles outside of Pinetop at the Junction of Hwy 260 and Hwy 73.

FROM FORT APACHE RESERVATION ROUTE:

Same as Canyon route until US Hwy 60 and State Hwy 77 intersect with State Hwy 73 (25 miles south of Show Low). Take Hwy 73 east through Fort Apache and Whiteriver. Hon-Dah is 19 miles north at the junction of State Hwy 260 and 73.

FROM I-40, HOLBROOK (67 miles):

Take I-40 South to Snowflake and Show Low on State Hwy 77, take Hwy 260 from Show Low through Pinetop/Lakeside. Hon-Dah is 3 miles outside of Pinetop at the Junction of Hwy 260 and 73.
